

CODES AND STANDARDS CORNER

A few weeks ago, I attended a well-focused and articulated code update on the 2012 Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code (USBC, and discovered that Virginia introduced some very significant code changes.



Virginia looked at the ICC IBC 2015 code edition for guidance and decided to delete Chapter 34 - Existing Structures. Chapter 34 is currently in Part I of the VUSBC 2009 edition or the Virginia Construction Code (known as the VCC). In effect, Virginia incorporated or moved Chapter 34 from the VCC to the VRC (Virginia Rehabilitation Code - Part II of the VUSBC) for existing structures. The 2009 VRC is actually the 2009 International Existing Building Code (IEBC), adopted by reference with amendments. Having known that ICC chose to delete Chapter 34 from the 2015 IBC and place it in the 2015 IEBC, eliminated a future code update effort. When the time rolls around for a 2015 code update, the work will have already been accomplished. Kudos to Richmond!❖

HIGHLIGHTS OF JUNE SUMMER PLANNING MEETING NOTES

This meeting is not an official board meeting, so no quorum is required. Luigi Grande, President of the NOVA Chapter, commenced the July 23, 2014 planning meeting of the Directors and committee members at the Grande Residence in Herndon, VA.

June Trade Show Event:

Overall: Positive feedback was received from vendors and members alike. The atmosphere was relaxed, but energetic and positive. The room suited was very suitable. The estimate for attendance was about 30 people.

Vendors

All 15 vendor tables were 'bought', which resulted in a full house. Many were new to CSI, so both the members and the vendors had an opportunity to meet new people. Next year, we need to make an effort to incorporate new vendors to minimize repeat (consecutive) attendance



- Food: Mike Clancy suggested not charging for wine next year, if the budget allows.
- In the Future:

All agreed that next year we need to increase the attendance. Advertising and reaching out to firms nearby the venue is one strategy to implement.

It was suggested that we explore the possibility of having four vendors commit to 15 minute presentations worth a 1/4 AIA Credit. If attending all presentations, a member could leave event with one full credit.

Monthly Meeting Location:

- Bob Trafton reported that in his last effort to find another venue for monthly meetings, he found there were no other conference/party rooms in the airport property that were available for us.
- It was agreed that the commute to the meetings remains a priority and is the main challenge. Use of the access road adds great value to the members and other attendees when traveling from the Arlington/DC area. Not having access to this road (and the time it saves) may be enough to sway some people to miss meetings.
- Jason will be asked to revisit the menu options with Marriott can they reduce portions? Eliminate dessert? Provide an additional option for vegetarian meals?

2018 Middle Atlantic Region Conference (MARC):

- Bob Trafton is leading the effort to plan the event. He has received the Region Host Conference Guide from Dave Lorenzini, Region Conference Oversight Chair. Ken Lyons agreed to assist, but many people will be needed for several committees.
- Venue options need to be explored soon and one should be secured ASAP. Target date should be established at next couple of
 meetings. Dave said that the number of attendees at the 2002 Conference hosted by NOVA was about 90 people.
- Several people suggested the venue should be in an 'urban' location that has close proximity to other activities and shopping. Tyson's Corner was discussed and recommended it should be explored due to new plans for high density development after the opening of the Silver Line Metro stops. It should be a very urban area by 2018.
- A theme/topic for speakers and programs could include urban planning, master planning, and a keynote about the Tyson's Corner development plan. Jesse thought he might have a contact to get the process started.

NoVa CSI Website:

- Luigi made a commitment to see that our website be revamped and updated. He and Tanya added a group photo of the Board from our May meeting.
- Luigi will publish the list of board members this month. Updates of the table top companies needs to be an ongoing effort. Our agreement with them is that they will be on the website for 12 months.
- Tanya showed us an example of the New York Metropolitan area newsletter, which included a column with common links to
 local and national CSI pages. We agreed this is a direction we should go also. Our banner image should also be updated to
 reflect a more current and forward thinking image.
- Kudos went out to Jesse and David for the newsletters that have been published this year.

September 2014 Meeting:

- Since CSI CONSTRUCT2014 is the second week of September (our normal meeting week). The board had voted In June to push the meeting to the next week, which coincides with the DC Chapter's usual date.
- Cynthia, Jesse, Henry Doyle, and Julian Master (from the DC chapter) have been in communication to plan this meeting.
